Please bring your latest statement for all bank accounts, CDs, credit union accounts, retirement accounts, stocks, shares and bonds. If you are employed we will require one month's worth of paystubs or if self-employed, we will re[1]quire your tax return from the previous year. Those with pensions will need to submit a 1099 or letter from the pension company. We will also ask for your Eversource bill, date of births and social security numbers for all that reside in the home. Please call the senior center at 203-574-6746 to make a Thursday appointment






