PRESIDENT DIGIOVANCARLO: Reminded everyone that the 2nd Budget Public Hearing Meeting was scheduled for Monday, May 27, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the Aldermanic Chambers, City Hall.

FOR THE GOOD OF THE ORDER:

- **ALDERMAN ALSEPH:** Informed everyone that the East End Community Club and the Bouley Manor Neighborhood Association will host a Rededication Ceremony at Hamilton Park's Stone House on May 24, 2025. The event will feature free food, a DJ, games, and exhibits, and recognition of the revitalization efforts. The area has been electrified and has lights. This event shall run from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm.

ALDERMAN MOSLEY: Amount of traffic accidents in the city. Alderman Mosley formally asked to have the Naugatuck Valley Council of Governments attend an upcoming BOA meeting to give a report. It's important to hear from them in order to address traffic accidents, particularly fatal ones, during the summer months. They are aware of infrastructure improvements and the Naugatuck Valley Council of Governments' traffic calming study, which will help determine the necessary steps to ensure safety for residents, drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. President DiGiovancarlo will reach out to City Engineer Roy Cavanaugh. Alderwoman Zimmermann expressed concern about speeding and requested bipartisan support for addressing this significant issue in our city.
