**PRESENTATION FROM THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING &
URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND LOYOLA DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.**

On a motion of Alderman Paul K. Pernerewski, Jr., followed by a second from Alderman Martin Misset, the Board of Aldermen voted unanimously to waive the reading of the Sheriff's Call regarding the aforementioned presentation.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN PRESIDENT J. PAUL VANCE, JR., explained that the purposed of the Sheriff's Call was for a basic presentation from HUD.

ALDERMAN PAUL K. PERNERESWSKI, JR., further elaborated that reasons for the Sheriff's Call was to discuss how the Loyola Project could affect the budget this year and to allow HUD -1 of the biggest players overall of this project - to come and talk with the Board to give a little sense of where they see the Loyola Project and how it fits HUD's overall plans. And further, to answer questions from any of the aldermen.

REPRESENTATIVES JULIE B. FAGAN and GARY R. REISINE of HUD explained HUD's role relative to ANY federal funding that it provides to a city. She noted that the federal government does not come to any local jurisdiction and tell them how to spend their money and nor does it give direction on it. It is understood, as well as respected by HUD that it is solely that city's business. She commented on the funding that the City currently received from HUD. She stated that last year a request was made by Loyola and the Waterbury Development Corporation -

for HUD to do an assessment and provide technical assistance to the south end neighborhood group to help them identify what the priorities would be to help revitalize that area, which is what ultimately lead to the current relationship. Many questions were asked of and answered by both Fagan and Reisine.

INTERIM OPERATION MANAGER EDWIN RODRIGUEZ, informed the aldermen as to the current status of the project and answered questions regarding this matter.
