The school will be cleaned and disinfected thoroughly as per defined protocol. We assure you that we are taking the steps necessary to protect the health of our students and staff.

- **Duggan Elementary School:**
 - Three staff members has tested positive. (*two impacted classes will transition to distance learning [through 10/23](#)*)

(As of 10/7/2020):

- **Tinker Elementary School:**
 - An in-person student has tested positive at Tinker Elementary School.
 - Per the District's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately and the appropriate notifications were made. The school will be cleaned and disinfected thoroughly as per defined protocol. We assure you that we are taking the steps necessary to protect the health of our students and staff.
 - The student who tested positive for COVID-19 has been instructed to remain home in self-isolation for 10 days. Additionally, they will need medical documentation prior to returning to in-person classes.
- **Kingsbury Elementary School:**

- School community member tested positive for COVID-19. Impacted class will transition to distance learning through Wednesday, October 21st. School remains open.
