Monday, Wednesday, and Friday: Drive-up & walk-up testing at Wheeler's Family Health & Wellness Center, 855 Lakewood Road, 9am-12pm.

Monday – Friday: Drive-up & walk-up testing at Community Health Center, Inc., 51 North Elm Street, 9am-1pm.

Tuesdays: Walk-up testing at Saint Mary's Hospital (near old Sears Store), 375 Union St., 9 am - 4 pm.

Thursdays: Walk-up testing at [Waterbury Police Activity League](#), 64 Division St, 9am-4pm.

Waterbury Public School COVID Updates

(As of 9/22/20):

- **Washington Elementary School:**
 - 1 positive case reported
 - *As a precaution all the students in the specific class will transition to distance learning through **Tuesday, September 29.***
 - Per the District's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately. The team has identified close contacts and is making the appropriate notifications.
 - The school will be cleaned and disinfected thoroughly as per defined protocol.
 - The student who tested positive for COVID-19 has been instructed to remain home in self-isolation for 10 days. Additionally, the student will need medical documentation prior to returning to in-person classes.

(As of 9/20/20):

- **Generali Elementary School:**
 - 1 student at Generali Elementary School has tested positive for COVID-19. As a precaution all the students in the specific class will transition to distance learning through Friday, September 25th. Per the District's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately. The team is identifying close contacts and making the appropriate notifications. The school will be cleaned and disinfected thoroughly as per defined protocol.
 - Additionally, three students, who are enrolled in the Virtual Academy, also tested positive for COVID-19. The city's Contact Tracing Team was one again engaged immediately. As the students have been learning from home since the first day of school, they have not been in the school building nor had any contact with any students outside of school
- **North End Middle School:**
 - 2 students at North End Middle School, who are enrolled in the Virtual Academy, tested positive for COVID-19. Per the District's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately. As the students have been learning from home since the first day of school, they have not been in the school building. As always, the safety and well-being of our students, staff and families is our highest priority.
- **Wilby High School:**
 - 1 student at Wilby High School, who is enrolled in the Virtual Academy, has tested positive for COVID-19.

- Per the District's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately. The student has been learning from home since Thursday, September 10 and has not been in the school building since that date.
- **School Bus Driver:**
 - On Sunday, Superintendent Verna D. Ruffin was notified by the City of Waterbury Department of Public Health that a contracted Waterbury Public Schools bus driver has tested positive for COVID-19.
 - Per the District and All Star Transportation's established protocol, the city's Contact Tracing Team was engaged immediately. We have been advised by All Star that the driver wore a mask at all times while at the terminal and while on the buses with students. Each bus was cleaned thoroughly between runs and at the end of the school day.
 - The driver has been instructed to remain in self-isolation for 14 days. All necessary steps are being taken to protect the health of our students and staff.
